VALUABLE ADDITION TO THE ARCHIVES

We have recently received a donation of two meticulously researched and documented year 12 school projects from the 1980s, the gift of the Henderson family who have had a holiday home in Blairgowrie for many years.

Elizabeth titled her assignment:

THE DETERIORATION OF THE BLAIRGOWRIE FORESHORE 1803 -1980. A project for Environmental Science for the H.S.C. Examination prepared with a view to presenting to the Council for the Shire of Flinders.

Five years later her sister, Ruth, followed up on the theme with:

OBSERVATIONS OF THE NATURAL AND MAN INDUCED CHANGES THAT HAVE OCCURRED TO THE BLAIRGOWRIE FORESHORE. 1980 -1985.

Both these documents were presented to the Shire of Flinders and used by the Council for planning and action in dealing with the problems of erosion. Both are illustrated with photographs, charts and diagrams. Together they form an interesting environmental commentary.

DIGITISATION PROJECT

Mornington Peninsula Shire MEDIA RELEASE 25 June 2012

Mornington Peninsula Shire is working with eight local historical societies to create virtual collections by digitising significant images and archives.

The **Local History Network Digitisation Project** aims to digitise the peninsula's historical collections to preserve photos, maps, posters and documents as well as allowing improved access to the collections.

The project will ensure a standardised digital format which is a recognised and accepted museum standard.

Mornington Peninsula Shire Mayor Frank Martin says preserving our history is an important part of our culture.

"The digitisation actually enables damaged photos to be brought back to life and documents that may be literally falling apart can be saved.

"This means our local history can be preserved into the future, prolonging the life of the historical collections and providing greater access to this information for our community," he said.

The project will assist local historical societies to reduce the handling of fragile materials and create a back-up of these precious archives and photos.

Murray Adams spent over a month at the Nepean Historical Society digitising collection items. Murray scanned approximately 2,500 original archival items including 700 photographs and 1,200 documents. This will enable the NHS to provide easier access to these materials to researchers while preserving the originals.

PORTSEA CAMP TOUR

Members and friends of the NHS enjoyed a tour of the Portsea Camp with the CEO, Stephen Eastop, on 16th July.

The camp has a long history. Originally an aboriginal site, from the 1880s the area was used by the military. There is still evidence of defence structures on the site. It began as



the Lord Mayor's Camp for Country Children in 1946.

"In the late 1940's it became apparent to the Lord Mayor of Melbourne, Sir Thomas Nettlefold, that children in the bush needed a break. Fathers had died at war, there were terrible droughts in the Mallee and there was no universal health care system. The Lord Mayor's Childrens' Camp for country children was established as a registered charity and the site was handed over as a temporary venue for children's camps.

The camps were a great success with many businesses, wealthy private citizens, service clubs, unions and the RSL and Country Women's Association providing volunteers and financial assistance.

Within a few short years, however, the Commonwealth attempted to regain use of the site and move the camp on. Much lobbying and fundraising by those involved ensured that sufficient money was raised to buy the property and this never eventuated.

In the early years up to 300 children were at the site at any one time. In 1995 the camp was handed over to an independent Board of Directors. The Board included members of the former management body and interested others. Together they united to ensure the camp's survival, became incorporated as a Company Limited by Guarantee and changed the name to The Portsea Camp." - from Portsea Camp Website

DEFENCE AT NEPEAN

It was a chilly wintry day but the 20+ people who braved the cold for the launch of the new edition of **Barrie Follows**' fascinating little book, 'Defence at Nepean' were soon warmed up by the excellent speakers.

Stuart Hughes, manager of Pt.Nepean National Park, spoke enthusiastically of the significance of Nepean and the new stories he had learnt from Barrie's very readable book. In response, the lively Barrie explained that it was at the behest of NHS's always thoughtful ideas man, John Alexander, that the first edition was written: a proposed pamphlet grew into a book in

Dr. Bob Marmion, former Victorian police detective, now professional historian and passionate life long researcher into the history of defence, gave us a fascinating insight into the findings of the investigation of Victorian defence. Bob is the editor and researcher for the Victorian Defence Project 1803-1945 which will result in the preservation of important sites and a detailed multi volume publication. We learnt that 40,000 people served in



Victoria's colonial forces while Victoria was a self governing colony and that there were 200 war scares (some admittedly a result of paranoid delusions.) We heard of the state of the art technology of the disappearing guns, top secret infra red beams across the Heads to protect the bay, even still remaining vestiges of tank traps zig zagging across paddocks. Over 250 sites have been identified as for defence on the Queenscliffe side of the Bay. These surely qualify this area to be described as 'the Gibraltar of the South'. How many sites might be found hidden in scrub on our side of the Bay? This is another story waiting to be told.

An unexpected but very moving bonus at this book launch was the playing of a short DVD Kutju Australia. It shows a group of children, Aboriginal and European learning and then performing Advance Australia Fair in the tribal Lutja language of the people from west of Alice Springs. Accompanying the voices are very beautiful photo



images of their outback country. Ted Egan is sponsoring and promoting this special project and hopes to extend it throughout Australia with the tribal languages of as many groups as possible.


HERITAGE & PLANNING

Sorrento Post Office

Australia Post ceased providing postal services from the Sorrento Post Office building at 10-16 Ocean Beach Road in July, and it is believed that AusPost has plans to dispose of the landmark heritage building.

The building, comprising a combined Postal Office and Postmaster's Residence, has important heritage significance. Whilst it remains Commonwealth property, it is on the Commonwealth Heritage List, with the Commonwealth having the heritage obligations which that entails, but once title passes it is no longer eligible to be so listed. Members of NHS are rightly concerned to see that the considerable heritage values inherent in the building continue to be fully recognised by the authorities. The NHS has obtained copies of the original title, the 1905 building plans and the contract

with local builder Charles
Haslett, prepared soon after
Federation in 1901 when
Victoria's Postal Department
passed to the new
Commonwealth Government.
The State made a Crown
Grant of the land with the
then existing building to the
Commonwealth, in return for
receiving compensation of
four hundred and fifty pounds.



NHS representatives joined

with Cr Rodgers and Council officers recently to inspect the property. Significance assessments of the heritage values of the building are to be found in the Shire's Flinders Heritage Study, as well as the current Commonwealth Heritage List. The building is structurally sound, and its heritage character is substantially intact. The original plan provided for the residence an entrance hall, sitting room, dining room, kitchen, scullery, bedroom, pantry, servant's room, a verandah with woodwork of the period, a wood shed and water tank. A 25-30 foot wide garden strip runs the length of the block, and abuts the two-story limestone wall of the neighbouring heritage property.

There have been discussions with other community groups and Cr Rodgers about the desirability and possibility of retaining the building for public use.
